

Don't Let Herod Spoil Your Christmas

We all know about the "wise men from the East" who followed the star in their search for the Christ Child. They were wise enough to seek Christ and also wise enough to outfox King Herod. When the wise men left Herod's court to continue in their search, Herod tried to fool them. He tried to use them. He wanted them to show him where to find the Infant King, pretending that he also wanted to worship; his real motive was jealousy and he planned to kill the Messiah. Foolish Herod! The wise men saw through his wicked plans. Rather than betray the Holy Child, they took another route home, avoiding Herod.

By disobeying Herod's command, they risked their own lives. Their protection of the baby Jesus also put others at risk. Long before the birth of our Lord, Pharaoh had baby boys killed in Egypt to stop the growth of the Israelite population. It didn't work. At that time, brave Jewish midwives disobeyed Pharaoh at the risk of their own lives and baby Moses was protected by his parents and his sister from being put to death in infancy.

There is a cost to obedience; but there is a greater cost to disobedience. If not for God's people taking risks, where would we be today? In 2016, dictators still want to crush those who might interfere with their plans. It's hard for us to imagine the brutality of Pharaoh or Herod today but it happens every day in China where mothers are forced to abort by the state. In Liberia, I am told that politicians sometimes hire witch doctors to offer child-sacrifices to improve their chances of electoral success. In Canada, our politicians may be more sophisticated but the result is the same or even worse. Over 100,000 innocents are killed by abortion each year. Now the elderly and the disabled have been added to the list of victims. Young peoples' lives are being destroyed by politically-correct propaganda about gender and behaviour. Those who resist this madness risk fines and jail time. Last week, our friend Mary Wagner was arrested again for offering roses to pre-abortive women. A teacher in BC was fired for telling his class he does not approve of abortion. Other teachers are told they must tell their students that homosexuality is as equally appropriate a lifestyle choice as traditional heterosexuality. One day every knee shall bow to the King of Kings and Lord of Lords; let's not wait for that day. Let's bow our knees today and let's openly confess our love for the Saviour of mankind. This is a time for boldness and confidence.
